### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

- 1. <u>HQ at base camp</u>. All teams must inform organizers of their planned trip to the cave: departing time, objective, and planned return time. Equally, they should not forget to report when they are back.
- 2. <u>Poor weather conditions</u> may hamper the cave exploration and prevent anyone from going further than -600m. For information, five tragic accidents due to heavy rain and flooding occurred in the past.
- **3**. This year's <u>objective</u> is to take as much waste as possible out of the cave. Each team commits to contribute!

#### RECOMMENDATIONS TO BE FOLLOWED

- Enter the cave only if you are fit and experienced in using Alpine caving technique (Single Rope Technique).
- All cavers should carry an emergency blanket, food, lighting and enough body warmers to
  withstand the very cold and wet conditions in the cave. Having a lightweight stove per team
  is also a good idea for preparing hot drinks and meals.
- The minimum group size for moving through the cave is 2 people. 3 is ideal, in particular when ropes are in use.
- All teams should be able to carry a mid-rope rescue, if needed.
- No one stay alone in the cave: adjust the group's pace to the slowest.
- Be prepared to help any team in trouble even if it impacts your own trip.
- As a matter of courtesy, priority on ropes is given to those climbing back up, except in Hurricane Pitch (puits de l'Ouragan).
- A "bottoming" trip must be reconsidered if getting as far as the Salle des Treize at -500m takes you more than 4 hours. In that case, please turn back.
- At Camp 1 at -500m, priority is given to teams returning from the bottom and heading back to the surface. The same rule applies at the surface camp.
- Any damaged equipment (ropes, karabiners, slings...) should be reported in order to be replaced asap.
